# Joe Mazuryk Wins Back to Back to Back 

First to win three in-a-row

JOE MAZURYK became the first bowler to win three consecutive NEBA tournaments after defeating Vinnie Furtado in the championship match at AMF Circle Lanes. Joe won his first title last month at The $40^{\text {th }}$ Anniversary Tournament, his second at The Tournament of Champions and his third this month at The $500^{\text {th }}$ Singles Tournament. It only took the twenty-six year old from Vooheesville, NY eight tournaments to accomplish this feat. At Circle Lanes, Joe secured himself a spot in match play with games of 196, 260, 227, 269 and 269 for 1221 on the Sunday morning squad. The righty earned a one round for shooting the second highest score in qualifying then defeated Jeff Morin (Hopatcong, NJ) 266-176, Al Tulacro (Wolcott, CT) 211-207, Duncan Harvey (Braintree, MA) 237-225 and Mike Lichstein (Broad Brook, CT) 60-59 in a ninth and tenth frame roll-off after a 257 tie. Joe took immediate control of the championship match by throwing the first five strikes. Vinnie kept the match within twenty pins through most of the match but, by the end, Joe only needed good count in the tenth to win his third title. With a great turnout of 290 entries and the five dollar increase in entry fee, Joe took home $\$ 2,300$ along with another championship trophy. Joe used his Storm Pearl Thunder Road, Ebonite Savage and Storm X-Factor to average 246 for ten games. There is no doubt Joe is the hottest bowler in NEBA but the big question is can he make it four?

VINNIE FURTADO from New Bedford, MA qualified on the 9 a.m. squad with games of 218, 180, 238, 245 and 245 for 1126. On his way to the final match, the right-hander defeated Jim Rusin (Swansea, MA) 216-213, Jeff Monahan (Bridgeport, CT) 203 tie then 20-17 in a ninth and tenth frame roll-off, John Kirker (Taftville, CT) 226-213, Jeff Moore (Shelton, CT) 206204 and Don Fournier (Pascoag, RI) 213-180. Although Vinnie bowled well in the final match, hitting the pocket 11 out of 12 frames, he had to settle for second place and $\$ 1300$. For the tournament, Vinnie used a Storm Big Hit to average 214 for eleven games. This is Vinnie's second runner-up finish in the past six months as he also finished second place in June, with his partner Mike Dupuis, in the NEBA doubles in Milford.
There were 290 entries at our first tournament of 2003. The at-large cut for $56^{\text {th }}$ place was 1091. Since we had over 285 entries, we paid extra spots. 1088 cashed. The score needed to receive a one round bye ( $8^{\text {th }}$ place) was 1177 . Three seniors out of twenty-five made the at-large or squad cuts so there was no senior cut. Don O'Malley was the high non-cashing senior with 1064. Squad cuts were 1102 on Saturday 6 p.m. (squad leader Rob Forester with 1218), 1113 on Sunday 9 a.m. (squad leader George Tignor with 1229) and 1062 on Sunday afternoon (squad leader Dave Botcowsky with 1173). George Tignor led qualifying with 1229 (257-265-234-215-258) on the 9 a.m. squad. Darrell Pesta shot 299 to win the high game out of the money prize of $\$ 50$. The Storm Core Power LRGs were won by Dave Zebrowski (1087), Mark Bouchard (1087) and George LeCain (Raffle).
